
Dear Parents/Carers.

What has been happening at Drayton Juniors?

REMEMBRANCE: Throughout last week's Collective Worship we focused on Remembrance commemorations, exploring the significance of the poppy. All classes learnt about the meaning of Remembrance in different ways, creating some beautiful art work and writing some touching thoughts and prayers. A special thank you to all who purchased items from The British Legion fundraising box. The money really does make such a difference. We were privileged and proud to participate in St Margaret's Remembrance service on Thursday 11th, laying a wreath on behalf of all at Drayton CE Juniors. It was a special experience for the Year 6 children who attended the service, representing the school superbly. They all appreciated the opportunity to meet former soldiers, getting the chance to look at an array of different, very lovingly polished war medals. COVID UPDATE: Currently there are 4 confirmed cases and 4 cases awaiting results across a school of 340 pupils. During this time the staff and children in 4L have been absolutely brilliant so a massive thank you to them.
