Reading has really come alive this term, with our many Reading Ambassadors taking an active role in the library, with the new electronic scanning system working really well and the library is becoming a buzzing hub of activity for all.





NORWICH CASTLE TRIP: As part of their 'Ancient Egypt' History study, all Year 3 classes visited Norwich Castle earlier this week. Using artefacts they learnt all about mummification, whilst also taking part in an ethical discussion about excavating Egyptian burial sites. Very happy children returned to DJS wearing the Egyptian Jewellery they made. Thank you to Mrs Bond for organising what was clearly a great day of learning.

STONE AGE DAY: On Tuesday Year 4 enjoyed an active day of hands on learning during their 'Stone Age Day.' This included building stone age shelters out of natural materials; cave art using charcoal and chalk, as well as working in teams creating an edible Stone Henge. ENRICHMENT: This week it has been brilliant work with other schools to provide valuable enrichment activities for Year 5. Our Year 5 classes have all enjoyed 'A Game of Sprouts' Maths lesson today with Mr Everett from Sir Isaac Newton Sixth Form Outreach. On Tuesday they also enjoyed IT workshops delivered by colleagues from Taverham High School, working with Aviva. Thank you to everyone involved in organised such great STEM learning activities for the children, helping them to understand how skills in the classroom can be applied in so many different ways.

DJS Information Update

ABSENCE REPORTING: Thank you to everyone who diligently keeps the office informed about absences. This greatly supports the school office, especially first thing in the morning when they need to order lunches by 10am. In recent weeks it has taken considerable time and effort to ascertain several children's whereabouts, resulting in a home visit on one occasion. Therefore, please be reminded that for safeguarding purposes all absences must be reported to Mrs Terrington/Mrs Hastings by 9:30am. Outside agency involvement may need to be contacted if the school is unable to locate absent children, following safeguarding procedures in place.

FILLING THE GAP: Over the last two years, Taverham Evangelical Church has been running the 'Filling the Gap' project, supporting local families in need. Previously they have provided food parcels for families in receipt of FSM, however organisers understand that there are probably many other families who need some support. 'Filling the Gap' are able to provide immediate food parcels, or can refer families to Norwich Food who also offer fuel vouchers and can signpost to other agencies. They can also make referrals to the Soul Supermarket where people can buy groceries and other household items for £3.00 per bag.

The school is also able to refer families. This can done via the school office where consent forms and information sharing will need to be agreed. All information received is confidential.

FOODBANK COLLECTION: As a community working together, support for those in need is only possible thanks to the kindness of others. With this in mind, on Wednesday 14th December we will have a Foodbank collection at Drayton Juniors, with items being donated brought into school hall from Friday 9th December. Having completed an inventory of items in their stockroom, Taverham Foodbank have informed us that they would be very grateful to receive the following:

MOBILE PHONES: For Safeguarding reasons, children should not be bringing mobile phones to school, storing them in their bags, however for some families we understand that your child needs access to a mobile phone when they leave school at the end of the day. In these circumstances, they should take their mobile phone to the office when they arrive at school and then collect it from there at the end of the school day. Teaching staff will remove any mobile phones from children if they are using them during the school day and the school will notify parents/carers to collect them from the school office.
